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## **REL 2300 World Religions**

**Credit Hours:** 3

**Prerequisites:** Appropriate test scores in reading and writing or exemption from placement testing

**General Education Category:** Communications Skills Gen Ed, Humanities Gen Ed

This course is designed to allow students to explore the theoretical and practical aspects of the religious experience, examine diversity among the world's major religious traditions and develop a broadened perspective on religion. Students will exhibit increased understanding of religious approaches to issues of social justice. This is a designated diversity-dedicated course.

## **REL 2300H Honors - World Religions**

**Credit Hours:** 3

**Prerequisites:** Appropriate test scores in reading and writing or exemption from placement testing

**General Education Category:** Communications Skills Gen Ed, Humanities Gen Ed

This course is designed to allow students to explore the theoretical and practical aspects of the religious experience, Investigate diversity among the world's major religious traditions, and develop a broadened perspective on religion. Students will exhibit increased understanding of religious approaches to issues of social justice. This Diversity-Dedicated course meets General Education and College Level Communications Skills requirements.

## **REL 2948 Service-Learning Field Studies 1**

**Credit Hours:** 1

This course gives students opportunity to understand the relationship of theory to practice through participation in a service-learning experience. Students are required to complete 20 hours of volunteer work, a service-learning contract, and an oral and written reflection of the experience.
