Entrance Requirements:

- Applicant must have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Applicant must be at least 19 years of age
- Applicant must be a citizen of the United States
- Applicant must not have been convicted of any felony offenses or any misdemeanor offenses involving perjury, false statements or domestic violence
- Applicant must pass a physical examination and drug screening
- Applicant must be of good moral character
- Applicant must satisfy the requirements of a criminal history background check
- Applicant must not have been dishonorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States
