
DETERMINING ENROLLMENT FOR FINANCIAL AID PURPOSES

and subsequently withdraws from a repeat of the same course, no future attempts will be included in financial aid enrollment.

Enrollment Levels

Enrollment for financial aid purposes is determined by the number of eligible credit hours a student is registered for and is defined as follows:

- FT (full time) 12 or more credit hours
- QT (3/4 time) 9 – 11 credit hours
- HT (half time) 6 – 8 credit hours
- LT (less than half time) under 6 credit hours

Courses in Program of Study

Only classes that are required for the student's declared program of study at EFSC, prerequisites for required classes within the student's declared program of study at EFSC, and developmental classes can be included when determining enrollment status for financial aid purposes. There is a limit of a maximum of 30 combined attempted credit hours for developmental and prerequisite coursework.

Audited Courses, Continuing Education and Credit by Examination

Audited courses, continuing education, and credit by examination are not included when determining enrollment levels for federal and state financial aid.

Developmental, Prerequisite & English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Coursework

A maximum of 30 combined attempted credit hours of developmental coursework, prerequisite coursework required for required classes within a student's declared program of study at EFSC, and EAP hours can be included when determining eligibility for financial aid.

Repeating Previously Passed Coursework

A course in which a grade of "A", "B" or "C" has been earned will *not* be included in enrollment for financial aid purposes if the course is repeated unless the course is designated in the academic catalog as repeatable and is applying to the student's elective degree requirements.

A grade of "D" is a passing grade for financial aid purposes regardless of any other policy requiring a higher grade. Only one repeat of a course in which a grade of "D" has been earned may be included in enrollment for financial aid purposes. A grade of "W" counts as the one allowable repeat of previously passed coursework; if a student earns a "D" in a course
